This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

The Gospel – John 15: 9-17

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

The role of treasurer has been advertised for several months with no interested from our church communities and the communities that we serve, which leads us to look at alternatives. We are now exploring paying a company to take this on. However, the initial quotes range from £400 - £1800 a month which we simply cannot afford. Especially when you consider that we are already running at an average loss of £1600 each month. Even with cheapest quote of £400 that would make our average monthly deficit £2000 which isn't sustainable.
